When Do Anxiety and Depression lead to Suicidal Risk in Youth?

Not all children and adolescents who struggle with anxiety, depression and other mental health disorders are at risk of becoming 'suicidal;' however, it is estimated that up to 90% of suicides occur in youth that have a mental illness and/or addictive disorder. Given this strong correlation, it is crucial for professionals who work with children and adolescents to understand characteristics of these common diagnoses that may lead to suicidal ideation, especially in connection with other known risk factors. Equally important for these professionals is the identification and understanding of the 'protective' factors that mitigate this risk.
