ORDINANCE NO. 2021-07

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 15, HOUSING, ARTICLE 2, MULTIPLE DWELLING CODE, OF THE GENERAL REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BOUND BROOK

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bound Brook continue to update Borough enforcement regulations for multiple dwelling units;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Bound Brook, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: CHAPTER 15, Housing, Article 2, Multiple Dwelling Code, of the General Revised Ordinances of the Borough of Bound Brook, is hereby amended and supplemented by removing strikethrough text and inserting the text <u>underlined and marked in bold</u> to read as follows:

15-38.2 Fees. [Ord. No. 03-05 § 18-31.2]

The fees for required registrations, certifications, inspections, reinspections, and all penalties assessed shall be in accordance with the fee schedule established by N.J.S.A. 55:13A-12, N.J.S.A. 55:13A-12.1, N.J.S.A. 55:13A-13, N.J.S.A. 55:13A-13.1, N.J.S.A. 55:13A-19.

15-38.3 Annual report to the Department of Community Affairs. [Ord. No. 03-05 § 18-31.3]

The enforcing agency shall report annually at the end of each fiscal year to the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs, State of New Jersey, and not later than July 31, the total amount of fees collected and inspections performed during the prior fiscal year.

15-38.2 Monthly report to the Public Works Code Enforcement Committee. [Ord. No. 03-05 § 18-31.4]

Monthly, the enforcing agency shall report a summary of its enforcement experience including the number of inspections, reinspections, violations, abatements, inspections due but not completed, and such other pertinent information the Public Works <u>Code Enforcement</u> Committee of the Borough Council may deem necessary to assess the operational effectiveness of the agency.

15-38.3 Annual review of provisions and operations. [Ord. No. 03-05 § 18-31.5]

The enforcing agency shall review the ongoing operation and applicability of this article and report to the Public Works Committee of the Borough Council on or before October 1 of each

year:

- a. Any recommended amendments, additions, deletions, or modifications to the provisions of this article.
- b. Any need to amend this article to codify changes to enabling Statutes.

15-39 (Reserved)

15-38.3 Annual Multiple Dwelling Filing Requirements

In Addition to each Annual Rental Registration Renewal, each multiple dwelling owner or managing agent shall provide the Borough, using the Annual Multiple Dwelling Renewal Form, the following information:

- a. <u>An itemized list containing each unit number, the building the unit is located in and</u> <u>the floor the unit is located on</u>
- b. <u>For each unit, the number of approved bedrooms</u>
- c. For each unit, the number of total occupants over the age of 2 years old
- d. <u>For each unit, the number of school age occupants enrolled in the Bound Brook</u> <u>School system as of July 01 of each renewal year.</u>

15-38.4 Regulations Established for Multiple Dwelling Occupancy

<u>All dwellings for rent or lease that are contained in a Multiple Dwelling Structure must</u> <u>adhere to the following regulations:</u>

- a.) <u>Each unit must be identified by a unit number and reported on the Annual</u> <u>Multiple Dwelling Filing as outlined is 15-38.3</u>
- b.) Each dwelling unit must identify the number of bedrooms in each unit
- c.) <u>No room other than the identified bedroom(s) are permitted to be used as</u> <u>permanent sleeping quarters</u>
- d.) <u>The maximum permitted occupancy in a one-bedroom apartment or studio</u> <u>apartment is two occupants. The maximum permitted occupancy in a two-</u> <u>bedroom apartment is four occupants.</u>

15-38.5 Violations, penalties and enforcement.

<u>This section shall be enforced by the Borough Department of Code Enforcement. In the</u> <u>event that a Housing Inspector in the Department of Code Enforcement determines that a</u> <u>violation of this section or any regulation promulgated pursuant thereto has occurred, the</u> <u>in spector may file a summons and/or complaint in the municipal court or</u> <u>cause the issuance of the same, whether or not a notice of violation or order have been</u>

served.

Owners and operators of multiple dwellings found in violation of any State Housing and or Borough of Bound Brook regulation are subject to a minimum penalty of \$500 up to a maximum penalty of \$2,000 for each violation.

SECTION 2: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 5: CODIFICATION

This ordinance shall be a part of the Code of Borough of Bound Brook as though codified and fully set forth therein. The Borough Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-08

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 21, LAND USE, SECTION 10.2, GENERAL PROVISIONS, OF THE GENERAL REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BOUND BROOK CREATE REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF REFUSE CONTAINERS AND APPEARANCE OF WINDOWS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bound Brook wish to maintain and enhance the aesthetics of the residential and commercial community; and

WHEREAS, additional regulations are required to enforce the storage of refuse containers and the appearance of windows within the Borough;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Bound Brook, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 21, Land Use, Section 10.2, General Provisions, of the General Revised Ordinances of the Borough of Bound Brook, is hereby amended and supplemented by inserting the text **<u>underlined and marked in bold</u>** to read as follows:

<u>x.</u> Refuse Containers as defined in 14-7.2, must adhere to the rules outlined in Chapter 14-7 – Refuse Containers and Dumpsters

y. Any window, window panel or glass area on any residential, commercial, or mixed-use building must adhere to the following regulations:

- 1. <u>Commercial window signage and lighting regulations as detailed in</u> <u>Chapter 21 Zoning.</u>
- 2. <u>Commercial storefronts must permit at least 50% visibility into the store</u> <u>area. Stacking of any merchandise and supplies withing 3'feet of any</u> <u>storefront window is prohibited.</u>
- 3. <u>Window treatments in commercial windows must present in good</u> <u>condition and are not permitted to cover greater than 50% of the vertical</u> <u>height of the window.</u>
- 4. Window treatments in any window must present in good condition

SECTION 2: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.
