ORDINANCE NO. 2022-27

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2, <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>, ARTICLE VIII, <u>ADMININSTRATIVE FEES</u>, SECTION 2-65 "ADMININSTRATIVE FEE FOR USE OF POLICE OFFICERS AND/OR VEHICLES ON EXTRA-DUTY JOBS"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bound Brook, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey, that the Borough Code of the Borough of Bound Brook is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 2, <u>Administration</u>, Article VIII, <u>Administrative Fees</u>, Section 2-65, "Administrative Fee for Use of Police Officers and/or Vehicles on Extra-Duty Jobs," be and is hereby amended and supplemented by inserting the text <u>marked in bold and underlined</u> and deleting the text [bracketed in bold], as follows:

- § 2-65 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE FOR USE OF POLICE OFFIICERS AND/OR VEHICLES ON EXTRA-DUTY JOBS
- A. [No change]
- B. [No change]
- C. <u>**The [R]rate</u>** of compensation for usage of a Department vehicle shall be \$[9] 15.75 per hour, except that if the Borough is paying for any road improvement job, such fee shall be waived.</u>
- **D.** In addition to the hourly rate for off-duty police in paragraph A hereof, and the hourly rate for use of Department vehicles in paragraph B hereof, the Borough shall, either directly or through its contracted vendor, collect an administrative fee to offset the costs of administration. The administrative fee shall include fifteen per cent (15%) due to the municipality and seven per cent (7%) to cover the administrative fee charged to the Borough by its contracted vendor.

SECTION 2. Severability Clause. If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance and they shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable.

SECTION 3. Repealer. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency. In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Borough, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions, and provisions of

the ordinances of the Borough are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-28

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BOUND BROOK SECTION 7-15, "PARKING PROHIBITED DURING CERTAIN HOURS ON CERTAIN STREETS" TO AMEND PROHIBITED PARKING HOURS ON CHERRY AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to amend the times for prohibited parking in front of Smalley Elementary School;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bound Brook, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 7, "Traffic", of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Bound Brook is hereby amended and supplemented by deleting the text **[marked in bold and enclosed in brackets]** and inserting the text **underlined and marked in bold**, to read as follows:

SECTION 2: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 5: CODIFICATION

This ordinance shall be a part of the Code of Borough of Bound Brook as though codified and fully set forth therein. The Borough Clerk shall have this ordinance codified and incorporated in the official copies of the Code.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-29

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF BOUND BROOK SECTION 7-10, "TEMPORARY PARKING PROHIBITION FOR SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL" TO PROHIBIT STREET PARKING DURING SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to prohibit parking on any street during a snow emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bound Brook, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 7, Traffic, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Bound Brook is hereby amended and supplemented by deleting the text **[marked in bold and enclosed in brackets]** and inserting the text **underlined and marked in bold**, to read as follows:

7-10. TEMPORARY PARKING PROHIBITION FOR SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL.

a. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the streets and highways, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on **[the]** <u>any</u> streets or highways or portions thereof **[indicated]**.

The above parking prohibitions shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

- b. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this subsection shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage, which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
- c. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing, on any municipal, county or State roadway within the Borough, which remains for more than 24 hours after a snowfall, shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any Police Officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage, which may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
- d. The above parking prohibitions shall remain in effect until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with

the normal flow of traffic. Any violations of this subsection will be subject to a fine of no less than \$50 or more than \$100.
