The total number of referrals received for the month of November 2024 was 47, with 33 referrals coming directly from BBPD and 14 from community sources. The breakdown of referral categories is as follows:

1. Domestic violence: 18


2. Housing/food: 9

All referrals were diligently contacted at least twice. Additionally, 35 out of the 47 referrals were successfully reached and connected to the appropriate resources or services based on their immediate needs.

Community Engagement

The CPAC team continues to provide weekly services to students at Bound Brook High School, maintaining a steady caseload of 5-7 students while working closely with the school's substance use counselor. CPAC, facilitates referrals and connections to community-based resources, including but not limited to food assistance, housing support, and immigration referrals.

This month, CPAC supported community members experiencing food insecurity by connecting them with:
