UPDATE: Asbestos Abatement at Bound Brook Memorial Library


Bound Brook, NJ (December 2, 2025) – The Borough is pleased to provide the community with an update on the ongoing asbestos abatement project at the Bound Brook Memorial Library, which continues to make substantial progress as it advances into its next phase.

Since work began on October 27, 2025, crews have completed several major components of the abatement plan. On the second floor, abatement activities are nearing completion following the removal of all filing cabinets and storage materials. The area above the ceiling has been fully sealed to ensure proper containment.



In the boiler room and mechanical areas, the abatement of pipe and fitting insulation has been successfully completed, and have passed the final air test.





Significant progress has also been made on the upper level, where ceiling abatement is now complete. Crews have removed the floor poly, tile, and mastic. In addition, the abatement team has finished removing the floor tile on the first floor, marking another key milestone for the project.

The Borough will continue to share updates as the project moves forward. Officials extend their appreciation to the public for its patience and understanding as this essential work is completed to ensure the safety and long-term usability of the library facility.

UPDATE: Asbestos Abatement to Begin at Bound Brook Memorial Library October 27, 2025

Bound Brook, NJ (October 24, 2025) – The Borough of Bound Brook is pleased to announce that asbestos abatement at the Bound Brook Memorial Library, located at 402 E. High Street, will begin on October 27, 2025. The Borough has awarded a \$321,000 remediation contract to Teal Management, with work expected to be completed by December 2025.

Following the completion of remediation and alterations, the Borough anticipates reopening the main floor of the Bound Brook Memorial Library in 2026.

The Borough continues to actively pursue grant opportunities to support ADA upgrades and various improvements aimed at establishing a barrier-free environment within the library. These improvements will ensure that the library is accessible and welcoming to all members of the community.

In support of these efforts, the Borough was recently awarded \$70,350 from the Preserve New Jersey Historic Preservation Fund. This funding will assist in the development of a Historic Preservation Plan, National Register Nomination, and Architectural and Engineering drawings for both the Bound Brook Memorial Library and its historic graveyard.

"We are thrilled to be taking this next step toward reopening our library," said **Jasmine McCoy**, **Business Administrator for the Borough of Bound Brook**. "The asbestos abatement is a major milestone in restoring this historic building, and we are equally committed to making it an accessible and inclusive space that serves all residents."

Until remediation is completed, the Bound Brook Memorial Library will remain closed and Somerset County Library System (SCLS) services at the location will remain suspended. The Borough continues to work closely with the SCLS and remains grateful for their ongoing partnership and support.

During the closure, residents are encouraged to visit any of the 10 open branches within the Somerset County Library System, including locations in Bridgewater, Hillsborough, Manville, Montgomery, North Plainfield, Somerville, Warren Township, Watchung, Branchburg, and Martinsville.

Borough of Bound Brook Plans to Address Remediation of Bound Brook Memorial Library in 2025

Branch Remains Temporarily Closed Until Asbestos Remediation & ADA Compliance Completed

Bound Brook, NJ (January 14, 2025) – The Borough of Bound Brook announces that it intends to set aside funding in its 2025 budget to address asbestos remediation of the Bound Brook Memorial Library and ADA upgrades required by the Somerset County Library System. Until the necessary funding is secured and the mandatory updates made, Bound Brook Memorial Library located at 402 E High Street must remain temporarily closed and Somerset County Library services suspended.

The Borough of Bound Brook was recently advised that the Somerset County Library can no longer direct temporary resources to Bound Brook for alternate site outreach and will revisit a new contract once the Borough can provide a suitable location for this branch.

The Somerset County Library System and the Borough of Bound Brook entered into a 2005 agreement requiring various improvements to the building, including enhancements to establish a barrier free environment on the library's main floor.

"We are working through identifying the necessary funds to address the environmental issues and ADA upgrades at the Bound Brook Memorial Library," said Jasmine McCoy, Business Administrator for the Borough of Bound Brook. "At the same time, we remain open to and are continuing efforts to partner with an appropriate temporary location in Bound Brook that could provide holistic library services while the asbestos issue at our branch is abated. We are committed to doing everything we can to resume local library services in Bound Brook and are thankful to the Somerset County Library System for all the assistance they have been providing to our community."

Bound Brook Memorial Library shut its doors in October 2023 after the Borough was made aware of asbestos in the building, an unsafe environmental condition that requires professional abatement. During 2024, the Borough explored various funding opportunities and no funds were available for appropriation at the time.

During the summer of 2024, the Somerset County Library System was able to provide mobile services in the Borough of Bound Brook's Commuter Lot located near the train station. Additionally, during the fall of 2024 through January 2025 printing and internet



services that Bound Brook Memorial Library used to offer have been provided out of Bound Brook's Municipal Court. However, these services will end as of January 31 until further notice.

The Borough of Bound Brook has explored temporary locations to host library services until funding was made available to address asbestos remediation issues and ADA upgrades at its branch, but have so far been unsuccessful in its attempts. The Borough intends to address the library remediation needs in this 2025 budget year.

Pending an appropriate satellite branch location can be established, or until the remediation and ADA upgrades of Bound Brook Memorial Library is completed, the residents of Bound Brook will need to visit one of the other 10 active locations under the Somerset County Library System. Those current open library branches are:
